A young hunter's generosity and a little partnership make a big difference in another young man's life

Earlier this year I was contacted by Oklahoma land-owner John Fugate. John and his 15-year-old son, Bret, have a good place to hunt whitetail deer, each taking just one buck from the property every year. Bret had very generously suggested to his father that, rather than take a buck himself this year, he'd prefer to give the opportunity to a young person who would not otherwise be able to have such an experience.

John asked me to help identify candidates for this special deer hunt, which John would fully outfit and guide, including all accommodations for the youngster's parents or other adult family members. I contacted a number of people who are interested in such projects, and I ended up with several candidates for John to consider.

Andy Keim, Director of the Oklahoma Youth Hunting and Shooting Program, had helped to assemble the list of candidates, including a young man by the name of Tanner Simpson. Tanner was selected for the hunt. Tanner's grandfather and grandmother, Jim and Mary Crenshaw, would accompany Tanner on the hunt.

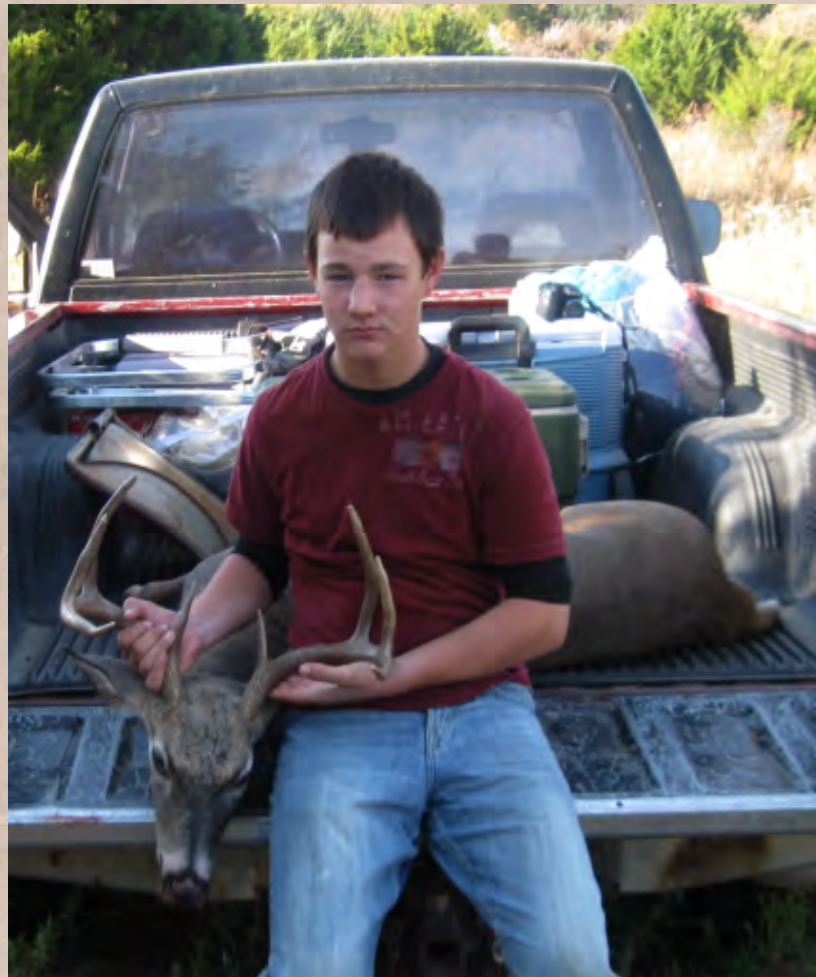

Dear oh dear how big was it?

Tanner Simpson 13 year old Grandson of Jim and Mary Crenshaw was very lucky to be chosen to go on an all expense paid youth deer hunt. The host of the deer hunt was John Fugate of Skiatook Oklahoma. He and some of his friends have a deer camp in Woodward County in western Oklahoma. Tanner was accompanied on the hunt by Mr. Fugate's 12 year daughter and 15 year old son and another couple's 9 year old daughter. The 9 year old was the first one to take a deer. She made the 125 yard shot to harvest a doe about ½ hour after sunrise on Friday morning. Tanner saw a small buck and a lot of doe on Friday, but not the deer they wanted to harvest. Saturday morning was another story, shortly after sunrise Tanner harvested a wide spread typical rack 8 point buck. After his shot Mr. Fugate's daughter and Tanner changed shooting positions and within a few minutes she had harvested an 8 point buck also. After the deer were field



dressed and the long drive home and checked in the not so fun part of the hunt begin, cape the buck for a shoulder mount. Ed Dutra with Coyote Trail Taxidermy had volunteered to do a shoulder

mount at no charge on Tanner's buck. Tanner said he very appreciative of every one involved in his being chosen for this hunt and he will have memories of this the rest of his life.

A YOUNG HUNTER'S FIRST DEER SEASON...

My name is Shaun and I am 9 years old and I am from Oklahoma. I would like to thank the Safari Club International, the Oklahoma Station Chapter, for giving me the chance to win a deer tag for the 2010 youth gun season and I wanted to share my first deer season, as a hunter. During the Hunter's Safety Education class in August 2010, I learned about safety, weapons, responsibility and lots of useful information. I thought it was too long, though. I found out about entering an essay contest to win a deer tag. My dad said he would buy me a gun, if I won the contest. My mom was mad at my dad because I won and he had to buy me a gun. When I found out that I won the essay contest, I was surprised by the gun, blind, and gun accessories. It was really cool!

I got to go to my grandpa's land and hunt during youth gun season. On Saturday morning, these two does came out and went behind this really big cedar tree before I could get a shot. Later, I wanted to go walking because I was bored. My dad and I went and sat down by a tree on a food plot. Chipmunks are annoying! It was right next to me! We got up and walked along the tree line towards our blind to eat lunch. While we were walking we spooked up another doe. I tried to get a shot, but I couldn't because she was gone. That afternoon, we cut down some of the cedars that were in the way.

On Sunday, I was sleepy and hard to get up, but I made it to the blind, barely. I fell asleep in the blind before the sun came up. Two does came in while I was asleep and my dad had a hard time waking me up. After I stood up, I fell over into the side of the blind because my legs were asleep, too. I didn't scare the does, though. I got my gun up and could not get a shot because I could only see was the white around its tail as they walked into the woods. We had to leave early because my dad had to go to work. We spooked up another doe on the way out, but I couldn't shoot because there was a house on the other side of woods not too far away.

I was disappointed I didn't get anything during the youth gun season, but I was excited about gun season because I had a second chance to get a deer. Finally opening day of gun season got here and back out to grandpa's land. I told my dad that I was not going to fall asleep in the blind today, but I did, again. My dad told me every hunter has missed a deer because of falling asleep. I woke up just in time to see a really tall 4 pointer come in about 7:30, where we saw those does. I didn't get my gun up in time because I thought I spooked it when I dropped my shooting stick. I looked up and he was still standing there, but I was now moving really slow because I did not want to spook him. He just walked off the way he came.

About 8:30 we were sitting there talking and this doe snuck in to our corn. She stayed around for about 5 minutes. I decided to pass on her because she was so little. I told my dad about 5 minutes later I shouldn't have passed on her because I might not see anything else and that I was going to shoot the next deer that came in. At 9:15, a 3 pointer came in; I was able to get my cross hairs on this one. My dad tried grunting at him to get him to stop, but the wind was blowing too hard. I squeezed the trigger and I jumped and we didn't know where or if I hit him. I wanted to hurry up and get out of the

blind, but my dad said we had to wait. I was mad because I didn't want to. While we were waiting, a spike came walking down the same trail as the 3 pointer. After about 20 minutes, we got out and started looking for blood. We could not find any. About 15 yards farther away, he started blopping blood everywhere. We followed the blood trail into the woods. After I found him, he still looked like he was alive because his head was still up. We backed out of the woods and went around behind him and poked him with the gun and he did not move. When my dad went to move him, we found out why his head was still up. His antler was wrapped around a greenbrier. The best we can figure is, he might have been a six pointer at one time, but he had broken off most of his left antler and his brow tine on the right.



I think hunting is awesome. This season will always be a something I can talk about the rest of my life. Just when I thought it couldn't get any better, I found out that I won a membership to SCI, as well. Thanks again.

Description: Guided Black Bear Hunting in British Columbia, rifle or archery.
Hunt dates are when the bears are fresh from hibernation, and hides are excellent.

This area has a very high population of LARGE color phase black bears, because of excellent habitat and the fact that it is not over hunted. We mainly hunt them only two weeks in the Spring season when they are fresh out of hibernation and concentrated on feeding areas where they are relatively easy to find and stalk. The hides are excellent at that time, much better than coastal bears because of our colder temperatures. Success rates are very high during this time, averaging 170% for many years, because many hunters will shoot two bears. The hides range in size from 5 feet to 8 feet squared.

Our bear hunting camp is located on a remote lake 80 miles West of Prince George, where I pick you up for the drive to the camp. Prince George has daily commercial flights from Vancouver, and you may also drive to Prince George. The camp is located right in great bear hunting, with good feed close by. From our bear camp we drive old logging roads that lead through old logged areas that produce excellent feed for the bears. We are able to spot and stalk the bears without long hikes. Often we can glass them from a distance and judge their size. We pick up the hides at the camp soon after the kill and fly them to the freezer at the lodge, insuring no spoilage occurs. Rainbow trout are plentiful at the bear camp, also at the main lodge at Moose Lake, where you may stay and fish after you have shot your bears. The floatplane flight to the main lodge for fishing is included in the package price.

Your hunt is 1x1 guided and includes the kill fee for one bear. You may take a second bear, paying only the US\$800 kill fee. Your hunt also includes the transportation from Prince

George, and the delivery of your trophies to a local taxidermist. A second hunter may be added for US \$6,000 1x1 guided, or the second hunter may share your guide for US \$4,750. As with your hunt, the second person's hunt includes the air charter and the kill fee for one bear; and a second bear may be added for an additional US\$800 kill fee.

Hunting license cost is \$180 CAN. Each bear license costs \$180 CAN. There is a Non-Resident Hunting Preservation Fee of \$125 CAN. All fees are subject to a 6% tax. [2010 costs quoted] All guides in BC charge the NRHP fee, and all guides in Canada charge the 5% tax. These license costs, fees, and tax are in addition to the hunt prices but the outfitter will purchase the licenses for you in advance. Any required firearms permit fees, transportation from your origin to Prince George and return, and tips are costs in addition to the hunt fees.

If you've investigated Canadian bear hunts, you've probably found them ranging in price from \$2,500 for the baited tree stand hunts to \$9,000 for a 2-bear hunt on Vancouver Island. The Fawnie Mountain hunt is for the hunter that wants super guides, big bears, quality food and accommodations, many great memories, all at a reasonable price.

Your hosts, the Blackwells have owned and operated this business for over 40 years. Some of the guides have been guiding here 17 years, some 13 years, etc. There is a sense of competition among the guides to find the biggest bears. The organization knows how to produce a quality hunting experience for trophy animals.

Suitable rifles are available if a hunter chooses not to bring his/her own. Archery is acceptable. Handguns are not permitted.

A non-hunting companion could stay at the lodge, with fishing and hiking as the activities; or may stay in the bear camp and accompany the hunter in the 4x4 and watching/filming the stalk. 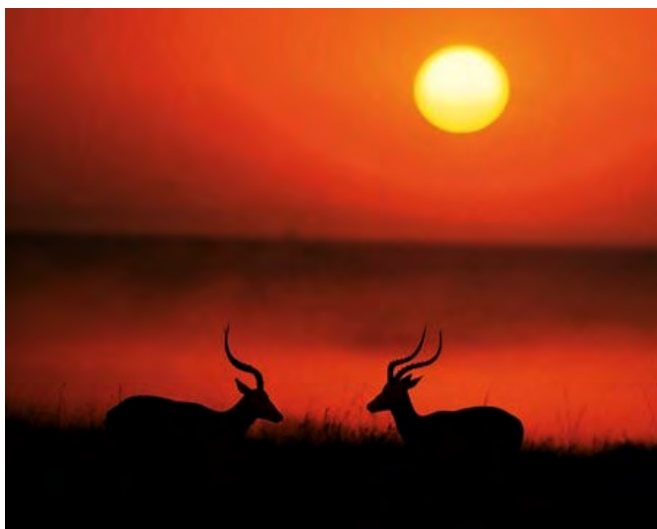

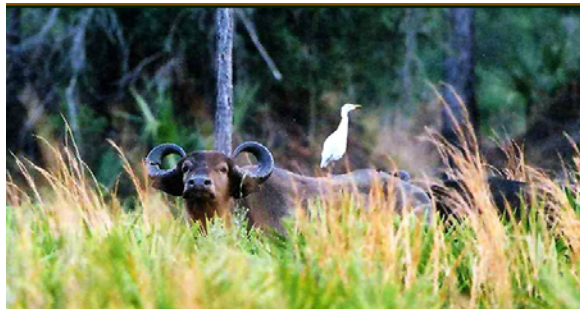

Four Oklahoma youth win outdoor getaways through writing contest

Youth from Eufaula, Hominy, Porum and Owasso schools have been awarded outdoor getaways for winning an outdoor writing contest designed to help youth share their hunting heritage.

Contestants in the annual youth writing contest — sponsored by the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation and the Oklahoma Station Chapter of Safari Club International — chose between two different topics and submitted entries to not only share their interest in the outdoors, but also to compete for a chance at a unique outdoor trip. Topic choices included “Hunting: Sharing the Heritage” or “What I like about Archery in the Schools and Bowhunting.”

Winners in the age 15-17 category will receive an all-expenses-paid antelope hunt in a western state. They were Calahan Henry of Eufaula High School and Amanda Swanson of Hominy High School. Winners in the age 11-14 category receive a scholarship to the YO Ranch Apprentice Hunter Program in Texas. They were Tucker Boland of Owasso Middle School and Gabriella Peebles of Porum Middle School.

“This has become a popular contest,” said Colin Berg, education supervisor for the Wildlife Department. “We always enjoy the process of going over each essay and trying to select winners. It can be challenging because there are some talented youth who are passionate about the outdoors who submit essays to this contest.”

The scholarship to the YO Ranch Apprentice Hunter Program and expenses for the antelope hunts are covered by the Oklahoma Station Chapter of Safari Club International with funds raised at the Chapter’s annual banquet.

The youth writing competition is designed to promote America’s hunting heritage among Oklahoma’s youth. It provides them an opportunity to express the importance of hunting in their lives and to affirm their commitment to carrying on the hunting tradition. Students use the essays or short stories to relive memorable hunts, to explain why hunting is important to them and to recognize mentors who have influenced them

to grow as hunters.

The contest winners will be eligible for entry in the Norm Strung Outdoor Writers Association National Youth Essay Contest, whose winners are awarded cash prizes and scholarships.

Students are not the only winners, however. Educators Jerry Hays from Hominy High School and Chris Dobbins from Comanche Middle School have been awarded an all-expense-paid scholarship to attend an eight-day conservation education school at Safari Club International’s American Wilderness Leadership School (AWLS) at Granite Ranch near Jackson, Wyoming. The AWLS program is conducted during the summer and presents an outdoor program for educators that concentrates on natural resource management. Participants learn about stream ecology, map and compass usage, fly tying, shooting sports, wildlife management, the Yellowstone ecosystem, camping, white-water rafting, educational resources, how to implement outdoor education ideas and language arts and creative writing in an outdoor setting.

“Each year we find that Oklahoma students step forward and reach new pinnacles of success not only through their writings and sharing of their experiences through prose, but in establishing lifelong relationships with others they meet and become acquainted with through this writing adventure,” said Sam Munnollon with the Oklahoma Station Chapter of Safari Club International. “One of the more exciting developments has been the interest not only in the essay contest but wildlife management and appreciation of the outdoors by those students being home-schooled as well as those who attend more traditional schooling venues. We are very proud of the Oklahoma youth and look forward to sharing their experiences and accomplishments now and in the future.”

The Wildlife Department and the Oklahoma Station Chapter of Safari Club International will submit the winning essays to the National Youth Writing Contest held annually by the Outdoor Writers Association of America.

THE HENRY'S HUNTING: SHARING THE HERITAGE

My hunting heritage started in 1895 when my great great grandpa Elbert Henry and his father Elijah Henry hunted the land for a living. At the time my grandpa, Lee Henry, told me that they had to depend on hunting to feed their families. The Henry motto was and still is "If you aren't going to eat it, don't kill it". They harvested mostly quail, turkey, deer, and rabbits because most all other species were protected.

Russell Frank Henry, my great grandpa, was an avid goose, duck and quail hunter. From the age of 12, in 1929, he helped supply the meat for the family table by shooting rabbits and selling them to the local grocery stores. (His duck hunting mostly consisted of local ponds then sneaking up over the dams, shooting ducks or geese as they took off.) Quail hunting was his favorite; he said there was just something about walking behind a dog and shooting the birds as they took off.

In 1933, Oklahoma opened the first deer season. My great great grandpa and my uncle Al Tuck became crazy about deer hunting. They would drive for hours

to get to southeastern Oklahoma to hunt the Kiamichi Mountains.

At the age of 8, my grandpa Lee started hunting with his father, Russell Frank Henry. He taught him new things about the art of hunting every time they went. The only gun my grandpa had at the time was a single shot 22 rifle. He was taught when shooting rabbits, to make the first shot count, so he didn't have to spend hours trying to find a wounded animal. At the age of 12 he got his first shotgun, a 12-gauge single shot, that he used when they hunted duck and quail.

My grandpa Lee has been involved in wildlife conservation, hunting and fishing all his life. He worked with the Wildlife Department to help stop the poaching of deer and help seed low-lying areas for migratory birds. In 1980, he was awarded the Wildlife Conservationist of the Year by the Oklahoma Wildlife Federation, The National Wildlife Federation and the Phillips Foundation. He also taught Hunter Safety Classes with Warden Bullet Burns and spent many years as a hunting and fishing guide. He owned Fountainhead Marina and Arrowhead Marina on Lake Eufaula for many years. This is where my dad Chuck Henry was introduced to hunting, fishing and wildlife

conservation.

My dad grew up hunting with my grandpa and just like all my forefathers, my grandpa taught my dad the art of hunting and how to live off the land. His first big game hunting trip was when my grandpa took him to Idaho for a high country elk hunt. My grandma got really mad because he had to miss a week of school. Although he did not harvest anything on that hunt, he still loved it and couldn't wait for the next one. Fortunately, later he drew out for a cow elk at the Wichita Mountains annual Elk Hunt where he harvested a large cow elk. A few years later dad became a trapper for the State of Oklahoma and the Federal Wildlife Department.

When I turned 7 my dad started to take me hunting and taught me the art of hunting and how to live off the land. When I was 10, I took a Hunters Safety Course and received my hunter's safety card from Warden Ed Rodebush. I grew up mostly hunting deer and turkey. At the age of 11 I was introduced to pheasant and duck hunting. Every year we go on our annual pheasant hunt in Pratt, Kansas. When I turned 12, my dad finally started letting me hunt by myself.

My grandma and grandpa live on a farm about one mile from my house and that is where I have hunted for the past 4 years. In 2007 I killed my first deer, an eleven-point buck. When he came running through that opening morning of deer season, I thought my heart was going to jump out of my chest! The bad thing about it was that he was with a doe, and she wasn't stopping, and since she wasn't stopping, he wasn't stopping! The only thing I could do was put my crosshairs on him, pull the trigger, and hope

for the best. And guess what ... The best happened! When I told my grandma and grandpa that I had shot an eleven point, they hopped out of their chairs and ran outside. Man it was the best day of my life!

In the year of 2008, the growing population of feral hog had started to infest my grandpa's farm. My big brother Russell and I have successfully harvest 5 wild hogs up to 400 lbs on the farm.

I also shoot a 50-pound compound bow and have taken 1st Place in 3 School Sanctioned Shoots.

I have now taken up duck hunting and absolutely love it! There's just something about watching ducks come flying in and landing in your decoys. If I didn't have to go to school everyday, I would be out in the woods or on the water hunting!

Through the years I have learned from my dad to be aware and follow all the wildlife rules and regulations, always ask before you hunt private property, and to make sure you clean up after yourself, so you leave the place looking better than you found it.

I am now very concerned with wildlife management and the protection of our game because hunting is my passion, and I plan on doing it to the day I die, I love the outdoors so much that when I finish college with degrees in Wildlife Management, Conservation and Marine Biology, I am determined to write, produce, and star in my own outdoor television show.

My hunting heritage began in about 1895 and continues on today with myself. I'm looking forward to passing it on to my kids and grandkids.

ARCHERY: WHAT I LIKE ABOUT ARCHERY IN SCHOOLS

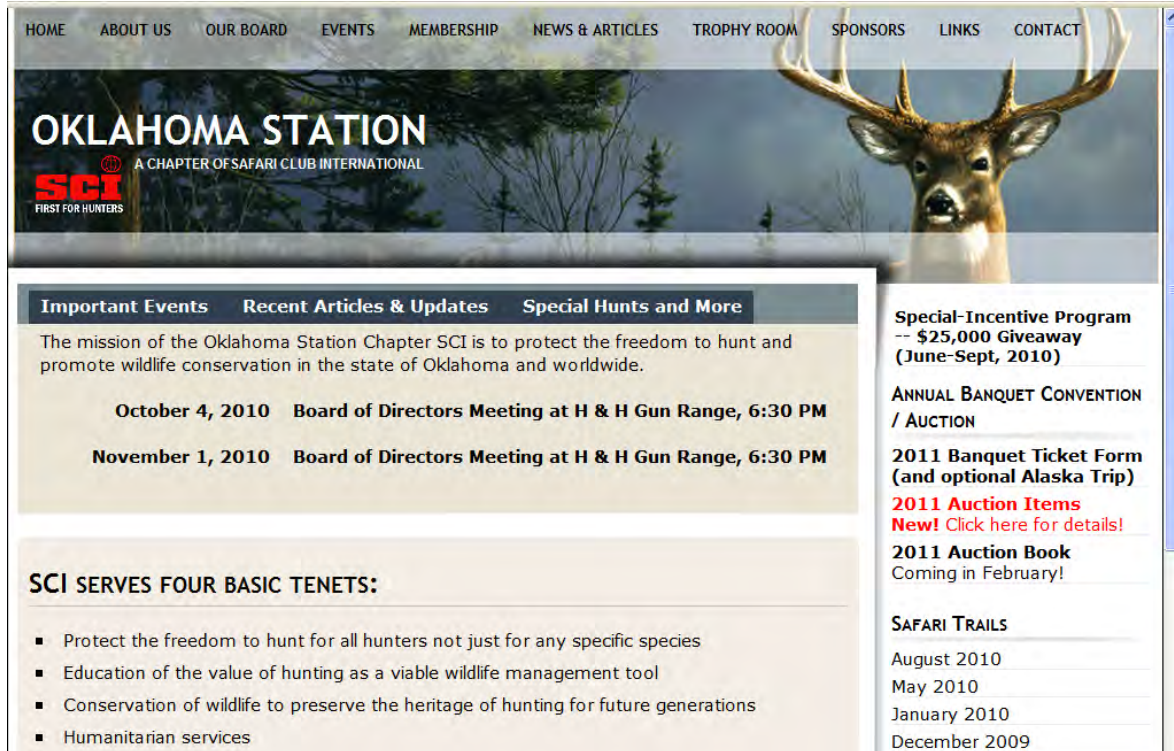

One bacterium kept at 98.6°, if left for 6 hours in an enclosed environment, can multiply into 131,072 bacteria. That's incredible! 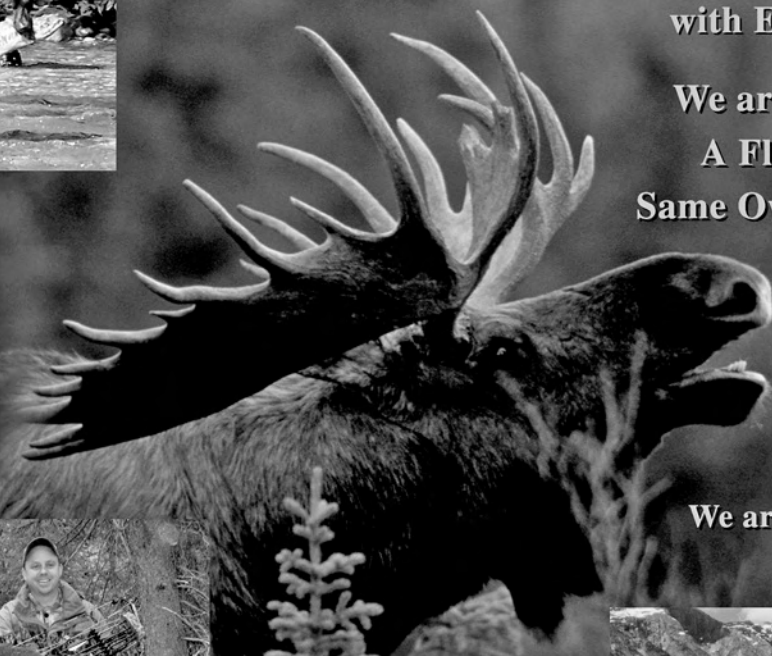

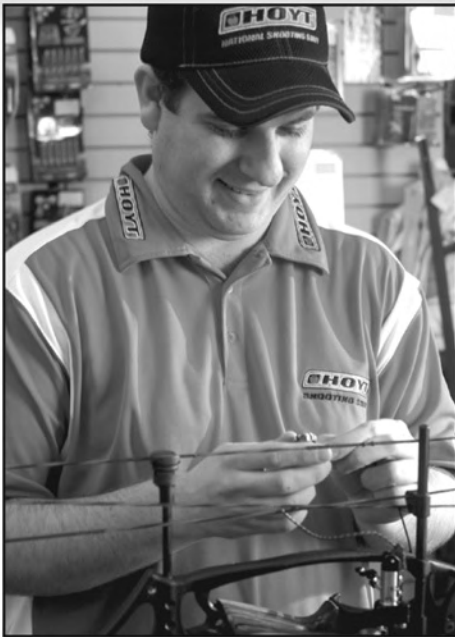

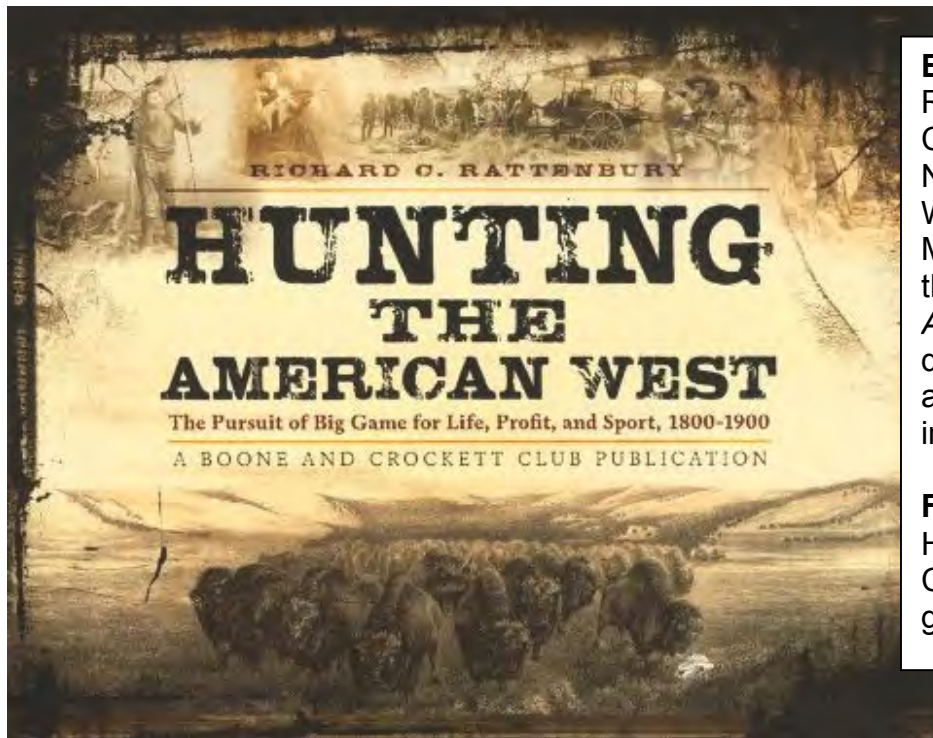
